When we launched our Breast Cancer Appeal at the end of 2018, we could not have imagined the tremendous support we would receive from businesses, organisations and the people of Norfolk.

From day one, the N&N Hospitals Charity has worked with hundreds of people all wanting to play their part in creating the dedicated Breast Cancer Unit to serve patients in this county and beyond.

Among those are members of Norwich Centenary Rotary who have spent much of 2019 working tirelessly to put together fund raising events. These include the Boudicca Charity Ball at the Assembly House in November and a Grand Draw to be drawn in December. I would like to thank the Stuart Stone and the Desira Group for donating a car for the draw and also thank Richard Hughes for his support and allowing us to use The Assembly House as the venue for the Charity Ball. The support of Rotary and the local companies is very important to us.

Our goal is to create a new Breast Cancer Unit which will provide faster diagnosis and treatment. Same-day diagnostic tests combined with clinical and imaging assessment will mean more patients only need to attend clinic once.

I am delighted to tell you that we have, so far, raised nearly early £200,000 and have purchased equipment which is already being used.

We are so fortunate at the Norfolk and Norwich University Hospital to have staff who are passionate about their work and who never stop caring for their patients. I am so proud of every member of the team.

Thanks to your support, we hope that very soon we will be able to offer a dedicated breast cancer unit to provide the best experience possible for our patients.

Why do we need a dedicated breast cancer unit?



The current NNUH breast cancer unit handles all referrals of suspected breast cancer from GPs, a number which has almost doubled in the last five years. It is where women (and men) undergo the range of procedures that determine if a lump is cancerous and, if so, where their treatment plan commences. With one in eight women set to develop breast cancer in their lifetime, the existing unit is struggling to keep up with demand.



Funding for this initiative will be charity-led, based on a detailed assessment undertaken by operational staff to ensure that the services to be funded are necessary and will benefit patients.

- Over the past five years, the current breast cancer unit has seen an 80% increase in patient numbers (645 referrals per month in 2018, compared cer to 360 in 2012)

- This high volume of patients means the current breast cancer clinic is now unable to provide a same-day diagnosis service to all patients
- At the NNUH we want to offer this service to all, to reduce stress and anxiety for patients
- The technology and equipment a new unit would offer would provide diagnosis on the day, avoiding the need for patients to return for additional scans or for their results



Norwich Centenary Rotary is proud to be supporting the Norfolk and Norwich University Hospital Boudicca Breast Cancer Appeal.

Rotary is a global organization which has been around for over 100 years. It currently has over 33000 Clubs and 1.2 million members worldwide. It welcomes all, regardless of race, colour, religion, gender, or political allegiance.



Rotarians are committed to trying to make the world a better place and Clubs are typically involved in International, District and Local projects.

Foremost amongst its achievements internationally is the PolioPlus program, launched in 1985 which aimed to immunise all of the world's children against polio. The programme has met with considerable success and polio now exists in only 3 countries worldwide – Pakistan, Afghanistan and Nigeria.

At a District level, 69 Clubs contribute to the Lend with Care program, which provides small loans to people in developing countries to help them work their way out of poverty. Currently District 1080 has invested over £270,000 in this scheme and as loans are repaid, money is recycled into loans for further businesses.

Locally Rotary Clubs are involved in a wide range of projects, raising money for causes central to their local communities, such as East Anglian Air Ambulance, East Anglia Children's Hospice (EACH), Leeway and Parkside School.
